#### 3 OTHER GIFTS

Pack full with other fun toys, hygiene items, and school supplies.

#### 4 PRAY

Most importantly, **pray** for the child who will receive your gift. Include a personal note and photo to delight the heart of the child.

#### 5 DONATE \$9 PER BOX
