Hugh, Brian and Tasha, Elder, and Representative of APNC, stand before congregation

Hugh: In July 2017 we celebrated the beginning of a new ministry with Brian Yount. It is now time to give thanks for the time we have shared in Christ, and to celebrate Brian and Tasha as they now begin a new chapter in their spiritual journey as Brian begins his new ministry with Springhill Presbyterian Church in Bozeman, Montana.
